





WyldLife is the middle school ministry of the larger YoungLife organization. YoungLife is a Christian ministry that reaches out to middle school, high school, and college students in all 50 states and 100+ countries around the world. Since 1941, YoungLife has sent caring leaders into the lives of kids, entering their world as mentors and friends.

Who We Are

Our team of leaders are all volunteers. We are local UNC students who truly believe in the mission of YoungLife and want to positively impact the Hillsborough community by being present and invested in its people. Each one of us leaders has a unique story of how we came to know Jesus. God has impacted our lives in radical ways and it has led us to want to share that with the students by doing life alongside them.

Mission

Our mission is to introduce middle school students at Eno River Academy and Orange Middle School to Jesus Christ. We want to help them grow in their faith by living life alongside them and loving them like older brothers and sisters.

What to Expect at WyldLife

WyldLife mainly consists of three types of events: Club, Campaigners, and Camp!

Club: Club is a party with a purpose—students from Eno and Orange gather every other Friday for a night of games, singing, skits, and prizes, with each event centered around a fun theme. At the end of the night, a leader shares a personal story connected to a story about Jesus and how it relates to our lives.. It's a warm, welcoming environment to introduce students to Jesus in a manner that's digestible and relatable so that anyone and everyone can understand!

<u>Campaigners</u>: Campaigners is a place to take a more in-depth look into the Bible. Students and leaders meet to read and discuss how God's story relates to their own lives. Whether in living rooms, churches, or even over dinner at Bojangles, the heart of Campaigners is exploring God's Word in a personal and engaging way.

Camp: Camp is a week filled with adventure at one of YoungLife's 20 incredible camps around the country. Students can enjoy activities like basketball, zip lines, the ropes course, and even special attractions like Go Karts or Parasailing. It's a phone-free environment where they connect with each other through games, skits, and competitions like Pool Olympics. Food is made from scratch daily in the kitchen and served on a round, 8-person table that welcomes a shared family style meal. Each day, they hear from the camp speaker who will share a story from their life and connect it to a relatable story of Jesus. Cabin Time usually follows the Club Talk; it's a space for real, meaningful conversations. The beautiful thing about WyldLife Camp is that we are leaders, not counselors. We do not exist only for a week at camp, but rather go with students to camp and then come home with them and continue to get to do life with them.
